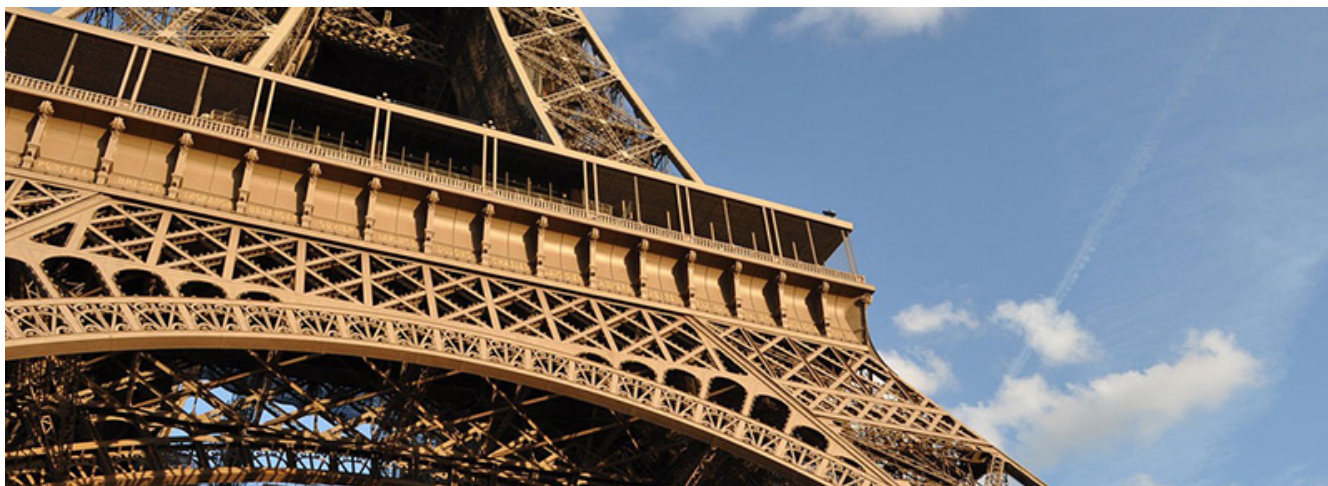


Guided Tour of the Eiffel Tower and Trocadéro – A Different View of the Eiffel Tower

Why did Gustave Eiffel build a 300meter tower in the heart of Paris? Why was it originally meant to be temporary? How did the World's Fairs reshape the banks of the Seine? And how did the Eiffel Tower, fiercely criticized during its construction, become one of the most famous monuments in the world?

An ideal walk if you want to explore the history of the Eiffel Tower without necessarily planning to go up, while enjoying some of the finest panoramas in Paris.

At a glance

- Where: Trocadéro, Eiffel Tower and ChampdeMars, Paris
- Theme: Paris, the World's Fairs, and the making of a global symbol
- Period: mainly the 19th and 20th centuries
- Approximate duration: about 2 hours

Extend your visit

Extend your discovery of the Eiffel Tower according to your interests, pace, and available time.

- Seine River cruise — After exploring the Trocadéro and the area around the Eiffel Tower, embark on a boat ride on the Seine. From the river, the bridges, quays, and major monuments of Paris reveal themselves from a new angle. This option pleasantly extends the visit while offering a more relaxed pace.
- Eiffel Tower ascent — An ascent of the Eiffel Tower can be added to the program when availability and booking conditions allow. It is intentionally kept separate from the guided tour to maintain flexible planning suited to your needs.
- Cité de l'architecture et du patrimoine — Housed in the Palais de Chaillot facing the Eiffel Tower, the Cité de l'architecture et du patrimoine is a particularly fitting extension for those who want to delve deeper into architecture, heritage, and the evolution of Paris.
- Musée de l'Homme — Also located at the Trocadéro, the Musée de l'Homme can round out your half-day with a focus on the history of humanity, societies, and key questions related to human evolution.
- Musée du quai Branly – Jacques Chirac — Just minutes from the Eiffel Tower, the Musée du quai Branly – Jacques Chirac offers a window onto the arts and cultures of Africa, Asia, Oceania, and the Americas. Its garden and architecture also make it a particularly interesting stop right by the route.
- Add a Taste of Paris — Extend your walk with a coffee and pastry stop or a relaxed lunch nearby, depending on the rhythm of your day.
